National

India to strengthen bilateral cooperation with Spain to fight terrorism

i. The Prime Minister Narendra Modi has signed seven agreements with Spain PM Mariano Rajoy to strengthen bilateral cooperation to fight against terrorism after the visit from Germany. Static Takeaways-

- PM of Spain is Mariano Rajoy and its Capital and Currency is Madrid and Euro
- Chancellor of Germany Angela Markel and its President is Frank-Walter Steinmeier.

India to be first in world to run all government ports on green energy.

i. All 12 major domestic ports will soon switch to renewable energy to meet their entire power requirements, making India the first country to have all government-owned ports running on solar and wind energy.

ii. The government plans to install almost 200 megawatt solar and wind power generation capacity at the ports by 2019. iii. Almost 150 mw of this will be solar power and 50 mw wind power generation capacity. The capacity could be ramped up to 500 mw in the next few years.

Delhi Police launch bicycle patrol

i. The Delhi Police launched patrolling on bicycle to improve policing in congested localities in trans-Yamuna region of the city. The move is also being billed as a green initiative. ii. The bicycle patrols will complement and supplement the existing motorcycle and PCR patrols which focus mainly on crime prevention along the arterial and main roads of Delhi. Static Takeaways -

Indian Railways to launch 'buy now, pay later' feature for tickets

i. To attract more passengers to buy online train tickets, Indian Railways has introduced a service 'Buy Now, Pay Later' which allow passengers to make payment for tickets booked online within a window of 15 days.

ii. To buy tickets from the IRCTC website and pay later will decrease the difficulties involved in the payment process at the time.

iii. ePayLater, a Mumbai-based fintech firm has joined hands with IRCTC for adding the new feature to Indian Railways ticket booking services. Static Takeaways -

India's GDP in Q4 grows 6.1%, loses fastest growing economy tag

i.India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) grew **6.1 percent** year-on-year during the January-March, 2017 period according to government data. With this, India loses its status of the world's fastest growing economy. China's GDP grew 6.9 percent during the same quarter.

ii. The GDP growth rate for the full year (2016-17) came in at 7.1 percent in line with official estimate compared to a revised growth figure of 8 per cent in FY16.

Prithvi-II missile successfully test-fired

- i. India successfully test-fired its indigenously developed nuclear-capable Prithvi-II missile from a test range in Odisha as part of a user trial by the Army. ii. The trial of the surface-to-surface missile, which has a strike range of 350 km, was carried out using a mobile launcher of the Integrated Test Range (ITR) in Chandipur, Odisha. Static Takeaways-

Telangana launches T-Wallet for people with and without mobile phones

- i. The Telangana Government has launched a digital wallet, named T-Wallet, which doesn't charge transaction fee from consumers.
- **ii.** T-Wallet is bi-directional in nature. While consumers use it for public and private transactions, the government can use it to make payments to various beneficiaries. It also can be used over the web version.
- iii. One can top up the wallet using credit or debit cards, Internet banking or through cash at Mee Seva centres. It allows a maximum transaction of **Rs1 lakh** for e-KYC (know your customer) users. For non-KYC users, the limit is set to **Rs20,000**. **Static Takeaways-**

Harsimrat Kaur Badal, Minister of Food Processing Industries. ii. To give a major boost to the food processing sector by adding value and reducing food wastage at each stage of the supply chain



with particular focus on perishables, Ministry of Food Processing Industries is implementing Mega Food Park Scheme in the country.

India ranked 137th in the Global Peace Index 2017

i. India has ranked 137th out of 163 countries on Global Peace Index 2017 published by The Institute of Economics and Peace. This is the eleventh edition of the Global Peace Index (GPI). ii. Iceland has been named the world's most peaceful country, topping the Global Peace Index for the tenth consecutive year followed by New Zealand and Portugal at second and third position while Syria has been named the least peaceful country. • The Global Peace Index (GPI) is an attempt to measure the relative position of nations and regions peacefulness across the world.

Odisha to have first automatic coastal warning for disasters in India

- i. Odisha is the first State in India to have developed an automatic public address system that can be activated along its entire coast.

 ii. The State government is all set to commission the ambitious Early Warning Dissemination System (EWDS) that
- would enable loud sirens go off simultaneously from towers at 122 locations by July 2017.

 iii. Odisha can now warn the vast population residing along its 480 km-long coast by pressing a single button from a control room in the State capital in the event of the occurrence of natural disasters like a tsunami or a cyclone.

Varanasi to get India's 1st freight village

- i. Varanasi will get the country's first 'freight village' spread over around 100 acres.
- ii. The plan to set up this project close to the upcoming multimode terminal along the Ganga has attracted major players including Dubai Port World and IL&FS.
- iii. It will be developed by the Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI) in Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh.

Static Takeaways-

- IWAI was created by Government of India on 27 October 1986 for development and regulation of Inland waterways for shipping and navigation.
- Varanasi is represented in Lok sabha by Hon PM Narenra Modi.

Airtel-Telenor India merger plan gets Sebi, BSE, NSE nod

- i. Bharti Airtel has received approvals from the Securities & Exchange Board of India (SEBI), BSE and the National Stock Exchange of India for its proposed merger with Telenor India.
- **ii**. Airtel entered into an agreement with Telenor South Asia Investments in February, 2017 to buy Telenor India's operations in Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Maharashtra, Gujarat, UP (East), UP (West) and Assam. These seven circles contribute about 35% to Airtel's total revenue.

India successfully test-fires 1st all weather tracked-chassis OR-SAM

i. India has successfully test-fired its first all weather tracked-chassis Quick Reaction Surface-to-Air Missile (QR-SAM) from a mobile launcher at Integrated Test Range at Chandipur in Odisha.

ii. The test was carried out for validating various parameters of the sophisticated weapon system to further strengthen its air defence system.

States agree to GST rollout from July 1

i. The GST (Goods and Services Tax) Council has cleared the pending rules, including transition provisions and returns, with all the States agreeing to the July 01st 2017 rollout of the tax. Transition rules have been cleared and everybody has agreed for a July 1 rollout," according to Kerala Finance Minister Thomas Isaac.

ii. The GST Council last month fitted over 1,200 goods and 500 services in the tax brackets of 5, 12, 18 and 28 per cent. Union Finance Minister Arun Jaitley has chaired the 15th meeting of the GST Council, which is scheduled to decide on the tax rate of six items, including gold, textiles and footwear.

India slips to 45th spot in IMD's World Competitiveness list i. India has been ranked 45th, down four notches from last year, in terms of competitiveness in the annual rankings compiled by IMD which saw Hong Kong topping the list. The list was compiled by the International Institute for Management Development's (IMD) World Competitiveness Center.

- ii. Switzerland and Singapore were ranked second and third respectively, with the USA at the fourth spot. Static Takeaways-

RCom-Aircel merged wireless company to be called Aircom

i. Reliance Communications (RCom) Chairman Anil Ambani has announced that the merged entities of RCom and Aircel will be called Aircom. These merged entities are Reliance Communications and Maxis Communications Berhad (MCB).

ii. The merged company will be one of India's largest private sector companies. It will have an asset base of over 65000 crore rupees and net worth of 35000 crore rupees.

EESL takes up first rural LED streetlighting project in Andhra Prad

- i. Energy Efficiency Services Ltd. has initiated a French Agency-funded project to retrofit 10 lakh conventional street lights with LED lights in Gram Panchayats of 7 districts in Andhra Pradesh. ii. This is the first project for rural LED street lighting in the country under the Centre's Street Lighting National Project (SLNP). Static takeaways-

 - Andhra Pradesh was the first state to seek assistance from EESL to replace conventional street lighting with LED lighting in Visakhapatnam.

Telangana launches single-woman pension scheme, first in India

i. Telangana government has recently launched the single-women pensions scheme across the state. Single women will be given Rs 1,000 per month. It is the first such scheme in India.

ii. The government had also increased the Kalyana Laxmi and Shaadi Mubarak scheme amount from Rs50,116 to Rs75,116. Children of single women would be admitted into all Telangana Residential Educational Institutions without having to write an examination or waiting for the lottery system.

India's first public bicycle sharing project launched in Mysuru

- i. Chief Minister of Karnataka Siddaramaiah has recently launched India's first public bicycle sharing (PBS) initiative 'TrinTrin' in Mysuru.
- ii. The World Bank, Global Environmental Fund, and state govt have jointly funded the initiative.
- **iii.** Mysuru is the first city in India to have a public bicycle sharing system. A total of 450 bicycles can be borrowed from 48 docking stations set up across the City for a nominal fee.

TRAI launches three new apps

i. Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) has recently launched three new apps to help customers rate quality of

services, speed and performance.

ii. The three new apps are Mycall app, MySpeed app and 'Do not disturb (DND 2.0)' app. The apps are being launched with the motive that there is more transparency between the consumers and the service providers.

Centre approves modifications to 'kambala' Bill

i. The Centre has approved the modifications to the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Karnataka Amendment) Bill 2017 to pave way for organizing 'kambala' in the coming season, according to PP Chaudhary, Union Minister of State for Law and Justice.

ii. Now, the Bill will be placed before the President for his approval. The approval by the President will help in the smooth conduct of 'Kambala' (the traditional slush track buffalo race) in Dakshina Kannada and Udupi districts of Karnataka. iii. The Bill proposes to exempt 'kambala' from the ambit of the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1960.

PM of India leaves for Kazakhstan to attend SCO summit

i. Prime Minister Narendra Modi left for Kazakhstan, where he will attend the summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO), and meet some foreign leaders, including Chinese President Xi Jinping.

ii. At the summit in Astana, India and Pakistan will become full members of the grouping, which at present comprises China, Russia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, and Tajikistan. Ahead of his two-day visit, PM Modi stated that he looked forward to deepening engagement with the SCO countries. iii. On the evening of June 9, he will also attend the inauguration of the Astana Expo with the theme of "Future Energy".

Kerala government implements 'green protocol' for weddings

i. Wedding ceremonies in Kerala are all set to become 'green', with the state government coming out with a green protocol to make auspicious occasions more nature-friendly.

ii. With the implementation of the protocol, plastic and other non-biodegradable articles including disposable glasses and plates and thermocol decorations will be kept at bay from marriage functions.

Indian American Raja Chari among 12 new astronauts chosen by NASA

i. NASA has chosen 12 new astronauts, including an Indian American named Raja Chari, from a record number of over 18,000 applicants, who will be trained for missions into Earth orbit and to deep space.

ii. The 12 new candidates include six military officers, three scientists, two medical doctors, a lead engineer at SpaceX and a NASA research pilot.

iii. Lt. Col. Raja Chari is the first Indian American after Kalpana Chawla to be chosen by NASA for one of its missions at NASA's Johnson Space Center in Houston. This is the largest group NASA has selected in almost two decades.

- i. Minister of Railways Shri Suresh Prabhakar Prabhu inaugurated Indian Railways' 1st HR Round Table Conference in New Delhi. The Conference was organized around three themes i.e.

- (3) Creativity Within Constraints

- i. Capital market regulator **SEBI** has given conditional approval for the appointment of Vikram Limaye as the MD and CEO of the NSE.
- **ii.** SEBI had delayed clearing his appointment as he was also part of the four-member Supreme Court-appointed panel managing the affairs of the Board of Control for Cricket in India. His term with the BCCI ends in August 2017.

EU, France grant 3.5m euros to curb emissions in India

Three Indian cities-Nagpur, Kochi and Ahmedabad -- will get the grant as part of the EU's commitment under the Paris Climate agreement according to French Development Agency (AFD).
- ii. More funds would be provided to India as the loan to take forward the smart city and sustainable transport initiatives in the three cities on the pilot basis. The MYC, supported by the French and German government, also has financial support from

- i. Kolkata, the 'City of Joy' is about to experience a wonder in the form of an underwater Metro train which will run beneath the Hooghly river. It's one of the path-breaking projects in India as never before a tunnel has been dug beneath a flowing river. ii. The entire project is 16.6 km long, out of which 10.8 km runs under the ground. Of this 10.8 km, 502 meters is under the water. The project connects Howrah to the west and Salt Lake to the

Patel Governor, Reserve Bank of India; with the year of printing '2017' on the reverse, are being issued.



ii. The new series earlier released and currently, in circulation has the inset letter "E". They will continue to be valid. The design of these notes is similar in all respects to the Rs500 banknotes.

ii. Uttar Pradesh has the highest number of 2,50,672 children engaged in labor, followed by Bihar with 1,28,087 children and Maharashtra where the number stands at 82,847.

India's first canal top solar PV system at NTPC Mouda i. State-run power giant National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC) has energized India's first 150 kWp canal top solar PV System on cooling water (CW) channel inside power station premises at its 2,320 MW, Mouda Thermal Power Project, near Nagpur in Maharashtra.

ii. This novel Solar PV system makes use of side walls of CW channels as load bearing structure thereby significantly decreasing cost of civil and mounting structure.

i. India ratified two key ILO conventions on child labor, according to a statement issued by the International Labour Organisation (ILO) in Geneva, Switzerland. iii. India is the 170th ILO member state to ratify Convention No 138, which requires states to set a minimum age under which no one shall be admitted to employment or work in any occupation, except for light work and artistic performances.

i. Aadhaar is not a valid identification document for Indians traveling to Nepal and Bhutan, according to the Union home ministry. Indians can travel to Nepal and Bhutan- both countries for which they don't need visas - if they possess a valid national passport or election ID card issued by the Election Commission.

ii. Moreover, to ease travel, persons over 65 and below 15 years can show documents with photographs to confirm their age and identity. These include PAN card, driving licence, Central Government Health Service (CGHS) card and ration card but not Aadhaar. The move is aimed at ensuring hassle-free movement of Indians going abroad.
