UNESCO designates Mumbai and Hyderabad as member of UCCN

i.UNESCO has

designated Mumbai as a member of UNESCO Creative Cities Network (UCCN) in the field of FILM and Hyderabad in the field of GASTRONOMY.



ii.The 7 categories for recognition under UCCN are Crafts and Folk Arts, Design, Film, Gastronomy, Music, Media Arts and Literature.

iii. Previously, 3 Indian cities were recognized as members of UCCN, namely- Jaipur-Crafts and Folk Arts(2015), Varanasi-Creative city of Music (2015), Chennai-Creative city of Music(2017).

iv.UCCN, created in 2004, is a network of cities which are thriving, active centres of cultural activities in their respective countries. The UNESCO Creative Cities Network now counts a total of 246 cities.

Govt releases maps of newly-created UTs of Jammu and Kashmir, Ladakh

i. The Government of India released the maps of newly

created union territories of Jammu-Kashmir and Ladakh and the map of India depicting these union territories. ii.According to the Home



Ministry, the new Union Territory of Ladakh consists of Kargil and Leh – two districts. The rest of the former state of Jammu and Kashmir is in the new Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

iii. The maps prepared by Survey General of India depicting the new UTs of Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh, as created on October 31, 2019, along with the map of India.

Moody's revises India's economic outlook to "negative" from "Stable"

i.The American financial service company Moody's has downgraded India's economic

outlook to "Negative" from "Stable". This

downgrade was due to slow growth in the economy. It also predicted that slow growth would be prolonged and would also have debt rises.

ii.Moody's has also predicted a budget deficit of 3.7% of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in the year through March 2020, which is a breach in the govt's target of 3.3%.

iii. This was due to corporate tax rate cuts, slow growth etc. The long term foreign currency bond and bank deposit ceilings were unchanged at Baa1 and Baa2(both being 2nd lowest investment-grade score), respectively.

India Justice Report 2019: Maharashtra holds top, UP ranks bottom

i.According to 'India Justice Report

2019', Maharashtra is the top state in delivering justice to its citizens followed



by **Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Punjab and Haryana** in the first-ever ranking of states on their capacity to deliver justice to citizens.

ii. The list of seven small states (population less than one crore each) was topped by Goa, followed by Sikkim and Himachal Pradesh. In this classification, Jharkhand, Bihar and Uttar Pradesh are at the bottom.

iii. The ranking is part of the India Justice Report (IJR) 2019, an initiative of Tata Trusts in collaboration with Centre for Social Justice, Common Cause, Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative, DAKSH, TISS- Prayas and Vidhi Centre for Legal Policy.
iv. The India Justice Report brings together, in the first such exercise, otherwise soiled statistics, from authoritative government sources, on the four pillars of justice delivery – police, judiciary, prisons and legal aid.



Lok Sabha Speaker addresses 6th Speakers' Summit of G 20 Countries

i.Lok sabha speaker Om
Birla composed the Indian

Japan 2019. G20 presiding

ii. The summit had three sessions on separate themes related to trade, technology and sustainable development.

iii.The gathering of this summit was about the terrorism which destroying the system of economy.

IIT-Madras launches affordable standing wheelchair

i.Indian Institute of Technology-Madras, in collaboration with Phoenix Medical Systems, launched the country's first indigenously-designed standing wheelchair.

ii.wheelchair named "Arise", was designed and developed by the TTK Centre for Rehabilitation Research and Device Development (R2D2), headed by Sujatha Srinivasan, a professor in the Department of Mechanical Engineering at IIT-Madras.

iii.The wheelchair is priced at **Rs 15,000.** The assistive device helps the wheelchair-bound move from a sitting to standing position, and vice-versa, independently.

i.Gujarat Government has given approval to the world's first CNG terminal at Bhavnagar port, Gujarat.

ii. The joint venture

of United Kingdom-based Foresight

Group and **Mumbai-based Padmanabh Mafatlal Group** will invest 1,900 crore rupees to set up a CNG terminal at Bhavnagar port.

iii.For this, a Memorandum of Understanding between Gujarat Maritime Board and London-based Foresight Group was signed during the Vibrant Gujarat Summit earlier this year.



Newly discovered species of spider named after Sachin Tendulkar

i.Dhruv Prajapati, a research scholar from the Gujarat Ecological Education & Research (GEER) Foundation, has



discovered two new spider species in Kerala, TamilNadu and Gujarat.

ii.One spider species was named after Indian cricketer Sachin Tendulkar as "Marengo Sachin Tendulkar" while the other was named as "Indomarengo chavarapater" after Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara, who played a key role in creating awareness on education in the state of Kerala.

Chief Justice's office comes under RTI, rules Supreme Court

i.The Supreme Court ruled that the office of Chief Justice comes under the transparency law, the Right to Information (RTI) Act.



ii. The decision by the five-

judge bench of the Supreme Court, led Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi, who retires on November 17, comes on a petition filed by Central Public Information Officer of the Supreme Court against a Delhi high court ruling of 2010 that held the office of the CJI was a public authority and directed the secretary-general of the top court to disclose details of the assets of judges sought by RTI activist SC Agarwal.

imposing President's rule in Maharashtra. ii. The Union Cabinet has recommended the President rule on the



report of the Governor invoking Article 356 of the constitution in the state.

iii. Article 356, commonly known as President's rule,

deals with 'failure of constitutional machinery in the state'

iv. The Governor's office stated that the government cannot be carried on in accordance with the Constitution, and submitted a report as contemplated by the provision of Article 356 of the Constitution.

Jair Bolsonaro to be chief guest at Republic Day 2020

i.Brazilian President Jair Bolsonaro will be the chief guest at Republic Day 2020 celebrations.
ii.He has accepted the Prime Minister Narendra Modi's invitation to be the chief guest at India's Republic Day celebrations next year.

Suranga Bawadi selected as World Monument Watch list for 2020

i.Suranga
Bawadi in Bijapur,
Karnataka was selected as
the World Monument
Watch List for 2020, by
the New York-based nongovernmental organisation.



ii.Suranga Bawadi was selected under the category of "Ancient Water System of the Deccan Plateau" along with 24 monuments across the world. iii.It is one of the integral parts of the ancient Karez system of supplying water through subterranean tunnels, is now set to get funding for restoration. iv.It was built in the 16th century of Adil Shahi-I in Vijayapura.

Nita Ambani to join board of Metropolitan Museum of Art

i.Chairperson of the Reliance Foundation, Nita Ambani has been named an honorary trustee of "The Metropolitan Museum of Art".



ii.This decision was taken due to her commitment to preserve and encourage Indian art and culture. She is the first Indian to be so honoured.

iii.In 2017, the museum honoured her at The Met



Winter Party, an event celebrating the achievements of those who foster greater diversity and inclusion in the world of art.

iv.In 2017. Nita Ambani received the prestigious Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Award from the President of India for the work of Reliance Foundation in the area of sports for development. In 2016, Forbes listed her as one of the 50 most powerful businesswomen in Asia.


v. She is a member of the International Olympic Committee and is the first Indian woman to serve in that role.

iv.PSLV-C47 is the 21st flight of PSLV in 'XL' configuration, that is with 6 solid strap-on motors.

v.PSLV-C47 will also carry 13 commercial nanosatellites from the United States of America as part of a commercial arrangement with NewSpace India Limited (NSIL), Department of Space.

Yogi Adityanath inaugurates North India's 1st sugar mill which will produce ethanol


i.Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has inaugurated North India's first sugar mill which will produce ethanol direct from sugarcane.

ii. The mill was inaugurated in Pipraich area of Gorakhpur, which is a unit of Uttar Pradesh Sugar and Sugarcane Development Corporation Limited. iii. The mills, which previously produced around 8,000 quintals of sugar, will now produce more than 50,000 quintals of sugar every day.

ii.It has a provision to remove the **President of the Congress**


party as a trustee and clarifies that when there is no Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, the leader of the single largest Opposition party will be the trustee.

i.Jammu and Kashmir have achieved the highest road length in the country this year so far under a Centre's rural roads' programme with the completion of around 11,400 kilometres covering 1,838 habitations.

ii. The work is being carried under the centrally-sponsored **Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana** (PMGSY), which is a mega flagship programme with the main objective of providing connectivity to rural areas.

Amaravati included in India map as the capital of Andhra Pradesh

i. The Survey of India, India's central engineering agency in charge of mapping and surveying has released an updated map of India with Amaravati as the

capital of Andhra Pradesh (AP).

ii. Amaravati had been missing from the previous map released by the Centre On November 2, 2019, which showed Hyderabad as the common capital of Telangana & Andhra Pradesh.

iii.The state of AP was bifurcated in the year 2014 and while it was initially decided that Hyderabad would serve as the common administrative capital for a period of 10 years.

Etawah Lion Safari inaugurated in Uttar Pradesh

i.The Etawah Lion

Safari, formally known as Etawah Safari

Park was thrown open for public in Uttar

Pradesh without the lion segment.

ii.It is a drive-through safari park located in Etawah, Uttar Pradesh and is one of the biggest safari parks in Asia with an area of 350 hectares (860 acres).

iii.It has been developed as an educative tourist destination for children as well as youths.



iv. The safari is expected to attract tourist and make Etawah a major tourist centre in the country.

Global prosperity index 2019

i. The first-ever Prosperity & Inclusion City Seal and

Awards (PICSA) Index, released in the **Basque** Country capital

of Bilbao in northern Spain.



ii. The Index is designed to showcase not only the quantity of economic growth of a city but also its quality and distribution across populations.

iii.Bengaluru emerged as India's highest-ranked city at No. 83 in a new index of the world's 113 cities in terms of economic and social inclusivity, topped by Zurich in Switzerland.

iv.Delhi at 101 and Mumbai at 107 are the other Indian cities to make at the index, with the top 20 awarded a PICSA Seal as the world's highest-ranked cities building inclusive prosperity.

- Vienna, the Austrian capital in second place, scores close to top marks on healthcare.
- Luxembourg Copenhagen, and Helsinki complete the top five.

India's GDP growth further dips to 4.5% in July-Sept

i. India's GDP growth hit an over six-year low of 4.5 percent in July-September 2019, dragged mainly by deceleration in manufacturing output and subdued farm sector activity. The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth was recorded at 7 percent in the corresponding quarter of FY 2018-19. In the previous quarter of the ongoing fiscal, the economic growth was 5 percent.

ii. This GDP growth data for the September 2019 quarter is the lowest since January-March of 2012-13, when it was registered at 4.3 per cent.

World's biggest Islamic Congregation begins in

i.In Madhya Pradesh, the 4-day Aalmi Tablighi Ijtima, world's biggest Islamic Congregation began in **Bhopal.** More than one million people from 54 countries are expected to attend the congregation which will continue till 25th November. ii.It is a forum for delivering some important religiousspiritual messages to Muslims around the world. iii. Ijtima started in the era of Nawabs in Bhopal and now it has become the identity of Bhopal worldwide. iv. The first Alami Tablighi Iitima took place in **Bhopal in 1944** and only 14 people attended it then. v. Now the number has increased to millions. Thousands of people from various countries across the world including Russia, France, Indonesia, Malaysia, Iraq and Saudi Arabia have reached Bhopal to participate in this event.

i.The first woman pilot, Lieutenant Shivangi, will join naval operations on completion of

i.Reliance Industries Limited (RIL) is the first Indian company to cross Rs.9.5 lakh in market capitalization (m-cap). Recently Vodafone India and Bharti Airtel had announced their tariff hike which will be implemented from December 2019.
ii.This has increased the share price of RIL in the market and is believed to attract more subscribers for Reliance Jio.

iii.On 26 Nov 2019, its m-cap touched Rs 9,99,045 crore nearing the Rs 10 lakh crore mark.

iv.Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), RIL's closest rival in market capital had a share price of Rs.2,110, 2% lower on BSE and m-cap of Rs.7,71,996.87 crore.

Logo, motto introduced for Lokpal

i.Lokpal Chairman Justice (retired) Pinaki Chandra Ghose launched the new logo and motto for the apex anti-corruption ombudsman.

ii.A new motto, "Ma

Gridhah Kasyasvidhanam (Do not be greedy for anyone's wealth)", was also adopted.

iii.Earlier, an open competition was conducted, inviting entries for the logo and the motto. A total of 2,236 entries for the logo and 4,705 entries for the motto were received.

iv.A logo designed by Prashant Mishra, a resident of Prayagraj in Uttar Pradesh, was finally selected.
v.The logo symbolises how Lokpal protects and cares for the people of India by establishing justice as per law.

Ayodhya Verdict

i.The Supreme Court on Saturday cleared the way for the construction of a Ram Temple at the disputed site at Ayodhya, and directed the Centre to allot a 5-acre plot to the Sunni Waqf Board for building a mosque.



ii. In one of the most important and most anticipated judgements in India's history, a 5-judge Constitution bench headed by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi put an end to the more than a century old dispute that has torn the social fabric of the nation.

iii.The apex court said the mosque should be constructed at a "prominent site" and a trust should be formed within three months for the construction of the temple at the site many Hindus believe Lord Ram was born.



iv. The bench, also comprising Justices S A Bobde, D Y Chandrachud, Ashok Bhushan and S Abdul Nazeer, said possession of the disputed 2.77 acre land rights will be handed over to the deity Ram Lalla, who is one of the three litigants in the case. The possession however will remain with a central government receiver.

Sabarimala verdict highlights: SC refers to larger bench, debate over entry of women remains

A larger bench will decide whether traditional practices can prevent entry of women at religious places.



What the Supreme Court wants larger bench to decide

- (i) Regarding the interplay between the freedom of religion under Articles 25 and 26 of the Constitution and other provisions in Part III, particularly Article 14.
- (ii) What is the sweep of expression 'public order, morality and health' occurring in Article 25(1) of the Constitution.







i.Former chief election commissioner TN Seshan passed away. A 1955 batch IAS officer of the Tamil Nadu cadre.







one behind".


iii. The day highlights the significant role of science in society and the need to engage the wider public in debates on emerging scientific issues.
